The Community Ambassador

Program for Seniors (CAPS) is a partnership between the City of Fremont Human Services Department, the Tri-City Elder Coalition, and six ethnic and faith-based organizations. CAPS provide volunteer ambassadors to serve seniors in their own communities, in their own language, within their own cultural norms and will do so where seniors live, worship, socialize and learn.

CAPS is funded by a grant from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation.

- Transportation
- Housing
- How to apply for benefits, such as Social Security, Medicare, or Medi-Cal
- Translation/Interpretation services
- Healthcare
- Legal/Financial Aid
